



Quick Facts



- **How much does it cost?**
 - \$150-\$200.00 club fee for the season plus memberships. If you are Junior DRAW member **without** a boat captain, you will wait until your application is accepted then pay your club dues and WWBYS \$50 membership/\$25 returning members.
No DRAW circuit in High School
 - Team Tournament Jerseys and Hoodies purchased separately from VOODOO \$65-\$75 (Optional)
 - Purchase club apparel through our online store link, the club receives \$5 per item sold (Optional Fundraiser)
 - **Cash for boat captain \$20-40 per trip to help with the cost of gas and maintenance of their boat is required!**
 - Overnight camping or Hotels at far lakes, such as Lake Havasu, Alamo Lake, Roosevelt Lake
 - Basic tackle, tackle backpack, rod & reel
- **Do I need a boat?**
 - Maybe, we always **need** boat/boat captains if you have a boat, please let us know.
 - If you don't have a boat, you will register with the DRAW form and placed on a WAITLIST.
 - Anglers under 10 may have their parent go out on the boat with them if they are in the DRAW circuit. We encourage all 8-year old's to be with their parent on the boat for their first tournament.
 - TEAMS only 3 allowed on a boat, two anglers and their boat Captain.
 - If you have a special circumstance, please let us know.
 - IF an angler does not have a boat/boat captain, they will be entered in a draw and placed with a volunteer boat captain.
 - This does not apply to High School anglers.
- **Who is the boat captain?**
 - A parent may be an angler's boat captain
 - Volunteer boat captains include parents, guardians, grandparents, and local anglers.
 - Volunteer boat captains have been vetted and have boat insurance per WWBYS/TBF standards. We follow a rule of 3: Two anglers to One Boat captain, if we don't have two anglers, we will assign an observer for the trip.
- **When do tournaments take place?**
 - Typically, 1 Sunday a Month (SEE SCHEDULE ONLINE)
 - All DRAW ANGLERS wishing to compete must **RSVP** through the **WEB-LINK** by the Friday immediately following the pre-tournament meeting. (The Friday One Week Prior to the Tournament.) **DRAW Anglers who do not RSVP by the deadline may be ineligible to fish that event.**
 - **Junior/High School TEAMS: ONLY RSVP IF YOU WILL NOT ATTEND THE TOURNAMENT**
 - **Weather concerns:** tournaments may be cancelled or cut short at any time, under the discretion of the Tournament Director. The children's safety is our top priority. If a regularly scheduled tournament is cancelled, we will try to schedule a makeup tournament.
- **How often do we meet as a club?**
 - One Thursday a Month, the Thursday meeting is a week prior to the tournament. *Virtual and In-Person meeting will be offered.
 - Community Service events may be held throughout the tournament season.
- **What species of fish do you catch?**
 - Largemouth bass and Smallmouth Bass
- **Does my child need to know how to fish?**
 - No, but some helpful things to know and be able to do:
 - Learn how-to tie-on hook, bait a hook (no live bait), and practice casting, visit our website for helpful videos
- **What can and can't I do for my kid on the boat?**
 - **Can:** Net the Fish, Run the trolling motor, Provide Pointers, Re-tie lures or rigging, clean out snarls in reels, be a POSITIVE influence.
 - **Can't:** Cast for the child, troll, or allow the boat to impart action on the luresRules and Regulations will be discussed during our **Registration Meeting September 8th**.
- **What does my child need the day of the tournament?**
 - **Life jacket**, tackle and tackle bag/backpack, rods, and reels 3-4 max, water bottle, non-crumb snacks, **boat captain gas money**, and most importantly boat etiquette.
- **What is it like the day of a tournament?**
 - Sign in typically around 5am, light snacks and Coffee/Juice provided in the morning
 - Team up with your boat captain and angling partner
 - Go fish from safe light until 1pm or later
 - Weigh-in experience across large stage if available, anglers and captains are provided light snacks, Gatorade, and water after they weigh-in.
 - As soon as possible clean out the boat of all tackle, rods, trash etc., to allow the volunteer boat captains to leave. Anglers will offer to wipe down their captains' boat.
 - Prizes and awards will be given after the weigh-in
 - Parents/Volunteers and anglers help with tournament clean up (We are always looking out for anglers that are going above and beyond to qualify for the coveted Sportsman of the Year award)
